



And the Winners Of The CSO Partners' Outstanding Annual Report Awards 2010 are.....

CATEGORY-I SMALL ORGANISATIONS

1. Ashadeep (WINNER)

Ashadeep - an organization founded in 1996 registered as a Society under the Societies Registration Act 1860 in Guwahati works in the field of mental health in North-East India. Ashadeep's focus lies on psychosocial rehabilitation for persons with mental illness. Ashadeep through its work addresses the impact and associated burden of mental illness for the affected individual as well as his or her family thereby moving beyond a mere clinical and medical intervention for persons with mental illness. The organization works to provide rehabilitation and care at the level of the family and the community. They also work with women who are homeless and mentally ill, with the ultimate aim of reintegrating them back with their families. The project 'Development of Community Resources for promoting Mental Health Care in the North Eastern Region' has resulted in the creation of Mental Health Interventions in six areas of three States of the NE region, where there were no such activity at the community level earlier.

Through the project 'Rehabilitation of Homeless Mentally Disabled Women' 45 women had been trained on various trades i.e. weaving, jute handicraft and Tie & Dye during their stay at the shelter homes. 25 women have been supported for livelihood generation after re-integration with their families. 34 women have been engaged in production at the shelter homes and are generating income.

2. Diya Foundation (RUNNERS UP)

Diya Foundation - a Vocational Training Center - provides training and employment to adults who are mentally challenged as well as to other differently abled individuals. Since 1999, DIYA is a registered charitable trust supporting people with disability gain self-esteem and become self-dependent, through training and employment. DIYA started with the support of family and friends. Diya Foundation envisages a future where a wide variety of work options will be available at Diya for any differently abled individual looking for work support. In the future, Diya Foundation is looking at becoming a Center that networks and links up corporates who are conscious of their social responsibility with differently abled individuals looking for job opportunities and job work.

3. Foundation for Initiatives in Development and Education for All (IDEA) (RUNNERS UP)

IDEA is a society registered under the Societies' registration Act 1860 since 2002. It works with the objective of promoting education amongst the marginalized people. It endeavors to work towards the minimum requirements of these children and also motivate their parents to make them realize their duties towards the children. The mission of the organization is to create awareness amongst the illiterate and poor on the importance of education for overall development and support them to educate their children.

CATEGORY-II MEDIUM ORGANISATIONS

1. Udayan Care (WINNER)

Udayan Care is a Public Charitable Trust established in year 1994 having its registered office in New Delhi. The organization has Udayan Ghars in Delhi, NOIDA, Gurgaon and Kurukshetra. The organization seeks to bring about a world in which each disadvantaged child enjoys a supportive family environment, opportunities for self-development and higher education, the dignity of self-reliance, and the ability and desire to give back to Society. The organization has programmes like Udayan Ghars to provide parenting and family bonding to orphaned and abandoned children. There is an Udayan Shalini Fellowship programme to help socially and economically disadvantaged but meritorious girls by providing them educational opportunities and mentoring. The Centre for Rehabilitation, Education and Thought Enrichment (CREATE) enables disadvantaged communities to rehabilitate themselves. It also runs Computer Training & Learning Centers and also works for health education and awareness programmes on HIV/AIDS.

Udayan Care has served more than 6500 children in more than 5 cities.

2. Dream a Dream (RUNNERS UP)

Dream a Dream is a Public Charitable Trust established in year 1999 having its registered office in Bangalore. The organization defines its work as "Dream a Dream empowers children from vulnerable backgrounds by developing life skills while at the same time sensitizing the community through active volunteering leading to a non-discriminatory society where unique differences are appreciated". The organization allows children to develop interpersonal skills, cognitive skills and develops their creativity, confidence, self-esteem and

passion to learn. It has also developed its own Life Skills Development Tools to measure child's progress in interaction with others, problem solving skills, taking initiative, managing conflict and understanding instructions. The organisation has collectively worked with over 1000 volunteers and 10 NGO partners to reach out to and impact the lives of over 3000 children from vulnerable backgrounds in and around Bangalore.

3. MUSKAAN (RUNNERS UP)

Muskaan is an NGO registered as a Society since 1982. The guiding philosophy of the Organisation is capacity building rather than charity and welfare and it endeavors to provide the highest possible quality of life to intellectually disabled persons. The organization also works towards empowering the parents through emotional support, counseling, sharing of the information and knowledge. It enables them to understand the development and other psychological needs of their intellectually disabled children and that is essential to facilitate the optimal development of their children.

CATEGORY-III LARGE ORGANISATIONS

1. Childline India Foundation (WINNER)

CHILDLINE is a society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and also registered under the Bombay Public Trust Act. The organization's registered office is based in Mumbai and it works for the protection of the rights of all children in general focusing specially on all children in need of care and protection, especially the more vulnerable sections, which include: Street children and youth living alone on the streets, Child laborers working in the unorganized and organized sectors, Domestic help, especially girl domestics, Children affected by physical / sexual / emotional abuse in family, schools or institutions, Missing children

It works as a platform by bringing together the Ministry for Women & Child Development, Government of India, UNICEF, Department of Telecommunications, street and community youth, non-profit organizations, academic institutions, the corporate sector and concerned individuals. CHILDLINE is the country's first toll-free tele-helpline for street children in distress. It has responded to over 13 million calls from children who live and work in Mumbai, and has grown into a national child protection service that operates in 83 cities. In 12 years, CHILDLINE has worked with over 3 million children in need of care and protection.

2. Swami Vivekananda Youth Movement (RUNNERS UP)

Swami Vivekananda Youth Movement (SVYM) is a Society established in year 1984 having its registered office in Mysore. The organization runs projects located all over Karnataka and reaches out to nearly 6 million people. The organization is strongly rooted to its values of Satya, Ahimsa, Seva and Tyaga and these are reflected in its program design and delivery. The organization is engaged in building a new civil society in India through its grassroots to policy-level action in the sectors of Health, Education and Community Development. The strong Development Support Team anchors for programs and projects of the organization. The organization aims to build a healthy community and to achieve this it runs hospitals and medical specialties. It also runs Tribal Mobile Health Units for remote areas. The organization also provides and facilitates Quality Education; Community Development Services and; Training, Research, Advocacy and Consultancy.

3. The Akshaya Patra Foundation (RUNNERS UP)

The Akshaya Patra Foundation (TAPF) is a public, charitable, secular Trust, registered in Bangalore. The Board of Trustees comprises missionaries of ISKCON Bangalore, corporate professionals, and entrepreneurs. The mission of the organization is to empower and enable underprivileged children by providing them with food for the body, mind and intellect. In partnership with the Central and respective State Governments of India, Akshaya Patra is the largest school meal program in the world; and therefore a unique and successful example of a public-private partnership.

According to various studies conducted the organisation has touched the lives of one million children. Through its employment programme they have reached 252 villages in the states of Rajasthan, Orissa and Uttar Pradesh through which 613 women have found livelihood.
